### MODERN FOREIGN LANGUAGE I

Modern Foreign Language I introduces students to the target language and its culture. The student will develop communicative skills and cross-cultural understanding. Specific content includes, but is not limited to, beginning skills in listening and speaking with special attention to pronunciation. An introduction to reading and writing is also included, as well as, the fundamentals of grammar and culture.

Modern Foreign Language II reinforces the fundamental skills acquired by the students in Modern Foreign Language I. This course develops increased listening, speaking, reading, and writing skills as well as cultural awareness. Specific content to be covered is a continuation of listening and oral skills acquired in Modern Foreign Language I. Reading and writing receive more emphasis, while oral communication remains the primary objective. The cultural survey of the target language-speaking people is continued.

PREREQUISITES: Modern Foreign Language I or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Modern Foreign Language I and teacher recommendation.

Modern Foreign Language III provides mastery and expansion of skills acquired by the students in Modern Foreign Language II. Specific content includes, but is not limited to, expansions of vocabulary and conversational skills through discussions of selected readings. Students' acquisition of grammatical concepts is strengthened by analyzing reading selections. Contemporary vocabulary stresses activities which are important to the everyday life of the target language-speaking people.

PREREQUISITES: Modern Foreign Language II or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Modern Foreign Language II and teacher recommendation.

Modern Foreign Language IV expands the skills acquired by the students in Modern Foreign Language III. Specific content includes, but is not limited to, more advanced language structures and idiomatic expressions, with emphasis on conversational skills. There is additional growth in vocabulary for practical purposes including writing. Reading selections are varied and taken from newspapers, magazines, and literary works.

PREREQUISITES: Modern Foreign Language III or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Modern Foreign Language III and teacher recommendation.

Modern Foreign Language V expands the skills acquired by students in Modern Foreign Language IV. Specific content to be covered includes, but is not limited to, developing communication skills through oral reports on literary and cultural topics, current events, and personal experiences. Reading selections include

newspaper and magazine articles, adaptations of short stories and plays, and surveys of target language literature. Writing is enhanced through compositions and essays using correct language structures.

PREREQUISITES: Modern Foreign Language IV or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Modern Foreign Language IV and teacher recommendation.

Modern Foreign Language VI expands the skills acquired by students in Modern Foreign Language V. Specific content includes, but is not limited to: 1) reinforcement of the students' ability to communicate and express ideas, feelings, and opinions, in oral and written forms, 2) further development of comprehension skills through the study of literary selections, and 3) reading and interpretation of works of great target language writers, while developing an understanding of major literary movements.

PREREQUISITES: Modern Foreign Language V or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Modern Foreign Language V and teacher recommendation.

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### SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS I

7509/07093000                      Credit 1    9-12

This course focuses on and emphasizes the development of the student's ability to communicate idioms and feelings, both orally and in writing. Comprehension skills are taught through selected readings. Included in this course is the study of Spanish-speaking countries and their cultures.

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### SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS II

7510/07093100                      Credit 1    9-12

This course reinforces the development of oral and written communication and the study of the lives and contributions of well-known twentieth century Spanish and Hispanic American historical figures, writers, artists, and musicians, as reflected in letters, speeches, and biographies. Included in this course is practice in descriptions of story characters, real persons, animals, and natural phenomena, as well as, memorization of facts and ideas.

PREREQUISITES: Spanish for Spanish Speakers I or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Spanish for Spanish Speakers I and teacher recommendation.

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### SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS III HONORS

7511/07093200                      Credit 1    9-12

This course emphasizes the basic principles of communication through an analysis of different types of media, including library research, data gathering, and the writing of news articles. The course progresses into the study of selected literary works in prose and poetry as a basis for growth in interpretative skills and vocabulary, with analysis focusing on words of Greek and Latin origin.

PREREQUISITES: Spanish for Spanish Speakers II or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Spanish for Spanish Speakers II and teacher recommendation.

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### SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS IV HONORS

7512/07093300                      Credit 1    9-12

This course expands the skills acquired by the students in Spanish for Spanish Speakers III. The course covers, but is not limited to, a survey of Spanish literature including short stories. Emphasis is placed on further enhancement of composition writing, oral presentation, and discussion skills. Practice is provided in the writing of business letters.

PREREQUISITES: Spanish for Spanish Speakers III or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Spanish for Spanish Speakers III and teacher recommendation.

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### SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS V HONORS

8001/07093400                      Credit 1    10-12

This course continues the development of oral and written communication skills acquired by the students in Spanish for Spanish Speakers IV. The course covers, but is not limited to, selections from Spanish and Hispanic - American literature. Further emphasis is placed on different forms of spoken language (dialogue, debate, interviews, panel discussion, and oratory), eighteenth and nineteenth century historical events in Spain and Central America, and in depth study of the grammar and an in-depth study of the culture of Spanish-speaking countries.

PREREQUISITES: Spanish for Spanish Speakers IV or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Spanish for

Spanish Speakers IV and teacher recommendation.

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### SPANISH FOR SPANISH SPEAKERS VI HONORS

8009/07093500                      Credit 1    10-12

This course continues the development of oral and written communication skills acquired by the students in Spanish for Spanish Speakers V. The course covers, but is not limited to, selections from Spanish and Hispanic - American literature. Further emphasis is placed on different forms of spoken language (dialogue, debate, interviews, panel discussion, and oratory), twentieth and twenty-first century historical events in Spain, Central and South America, and in depth study of the grammar and an in depth study of the culture of Spanish-speaking countries.

PREREQUISITES: Spanish for Spanish Speakers V or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Spanish for Spanish Speakers V and teacher recommendation.

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### LATIN I

7513/07063000    9-12

Latin I introduces students to fundamental Latin vocabulary and grammar, and to classical culture. Specific content includes, but is not limited to, English derivatives and vocabulary based on Latin, basic grammatical structures of Latin; simple short stories for comprehension, including their translation into English; classical heroes and legends, with special attention to classical myths; and selected aspects of life in a Roman family.

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### LATIN II

7514/07063100    9-12

Latin II continues with the same content and concepts of Latin

I, stressing the grammar and vocabulary necessary for the reading and appreciation of Latin authors, particularly Caesar's writings. This reading increases the students' understanding of sentence structure, English word-origin, and Roman history and customs.

**PREREQUISITES:** Latin I or Mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Latin I and teacher recommendation.

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**LATIN III HONORS** 7515/07063200  
Credit 1 9-12

Latin III continues the study of the Latin language and the Roman history and culture covered in Latin II. Specific content includes, but is not limited to, the review and expansion of the essentials of Latin grammar; readings in prose; the study of the Roman civilization through its literature with emphasis on politics, history and mythology; and intensive derivative study to refine the students' English vocabulary.

**PREREQUISITES:** Latin II or Mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Latin II and teacher recommendation.

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**LATIN IV HONORS** 7516/07063300  
Credit 1 9-12

Latin IV provides the advanced Latin student an opportunity to study Latin epic and lyric poetry with the purposes of expanding vocabulary, reinforcing forms and structures, and developing social, literary, and critical thinking skills. Specific content covered includes, but is not limited to, a general view of the literature of the Augustan Age with emphasis on the study of Vergil and other authors, their lives, and works.

**PREREQUISITES:** Latin II and/or Latin III or Mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to either of these courses and teacher recommendation.

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**ADVANCED PLACEMENT LATIN**  
**Vergil** 7593/07063700

**Catullus-Ovid** 7594/07063600  
Credit 1 11-12

Advanced Placement Latin develops oral and written fluency in the language and prepares students to take the Advanced Placement test. The content includes, but is not limited to, content determined by the Advanced Placement Program guidelines, with emphasis on the author(s) as specified in the course content.

**PREREQUISITES:** Latin IV or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to Latin IV and teacher recommendation.

**PROGRAM NOTE: Vergil and Catullus-Ovid are offered in alternate years.**

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**AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE I** 6968/07173000  
Credit 1 9-12

The purpose of this course is to teach hearing students basic conversational skills in American Sign Language (ASL) and awareness of various aspects of deafness. The content should include, but not be limited to, conversational vocabulary and the grammatical features and principles of ASL. The audiological, educational social, cultural, and historical aspects of deafness are also included.

**PREREQUISITES:** None

**Special Note:** May be substituted for Foreign Language University requirement. NCAA

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**AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE II** 6969/07173100  
Credit 1 9-12

The purpose of this course is to further develop hearing student's knowledge of the American Sign Language. The content should include, but not be limited to, conversational skills in ASL, its syntax and principles, and the cultural aspect of the deaf community. This course will provide students with an accumulated receptive and expressive vocabulary of 1,500 signs.

**PREREQUISITE:** American Sign Language I (ASL I) or mastery of student performance standards corresponding to ASL I and teacher recommendation

**Special Note:** May be substituted for Foreign Language University requirement. NCAA

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**AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE III HONORS** 6970/07173120  
Credit 1 10-12

The purpose of this course is to master and expand the skills acquired by hearing students of American Sign Language II. Specific content to be covered includes, but is not limited to, expansion of vocabulary with respective signs and conversational skills in ASL, various types of interpreting and settings.

**PREREQUISITE:** American Sign Language II (ASL) or mastery of Student Performance Standards corresponding to ASL II and teacher recommendation.
